

Having a Positive Attitude During Difficult Times



These are difficult times the world is in, more specifically this country is in and to put it directly, black people are in. As Christians we do not focus on the physical like race, but on the spiritual and recognize the avenues in which the forces of darkness operate through.

As Christians we must acknowledge our surroundings and be aware of what's going on in life, in our families, and internally. Hence the scripture in 1 Pet 5:8, "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour:".

We can not allow Satan to devour us by being spiritually blindsided, for Ephesians 6 warns us of attacks: 10-11 "Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places". In order to have a positive attitude during difficult times, we must knowledge the times or situations that we are in. Awareness is key.

What does it mean to have a positive attitude from a Christian perspective? To truly ask this question would be to say what does it mean to have a positive attitude from a spiritual perspective, because we as Christians acknowledge our spiritual state first. The answer is to draw near to God. Knowing that God and the Holy Spirit are one, the God and the Holy Spirit can help us to have a positive attitude especially when we call on him. James 4:8 "Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners; and purify your hearts, you double-minded". Jeremiah 2:12-13 "Then you will call upon Me and go and pray to Me, and I will listen to you. And you will seek Me and find Me, when you search for Me with all your heart".

Now that may look different for each individual because of one's level of spiritual maturity or their experience with dealing with life issues and situations. For some drawing near to God will be praying more, for others it will be reading and studying encouraging scriptures more, for some singing encouraging songs more, and for others speaking with spiritually minded brothers and sisters and for some they do all those things.

Regarding difficult times, we can't just focus on the response, but have to invest in prevention. A positive (correct) attitude includes prevention, solutions, and communication if needed. A positive response to difficult times should include to separate, isolate, reflect, plan, act or communicate (Matt 6:6, John 14:16-18, 2 Cor 13:5, Rom 12:18, Rom 8:28, Phil 4: 4-9). James 1:12 also speaks on the rewards for be steadfast during difficult times. Matt 5:13-16 speaks to the "Why" we should have a positive attitude.

In conclusion, our response to difficult times must be deliberate and planned. We must possess a thermostat vs thermometer type of thinking. Please know that God has not left us without help. John 14:26 But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you. Also read Psalms 121:1-8 for some serious encouragement. I leave you with this: "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will" - Romans 12:2. May God bless and Keep us as we strive to have a positive attitude during difficult times.
