

Aim Of This Lesson— To show Christians how to be hopeful and joyful when they experience Satan's efforts to destroy their faith.

Scripture text: --Romans 14:17-18 nkjv <sup>17</sup> for the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit. <sup>18</sup> For he who serves Christ in these things is acceptable to God and approved by men.

- Joy—character trait required of a disciple easily forgotten.
- Paul says, "the kingdom of God is joy in the Holy Spirit."
- God places an importance of each of us having joy in our lives.
  - This concept has been twisted and distorted into "God wants me to be happy."

- We sacrifice our families for more possessions.
- We press for success and power.
- We think we will find happiness in our work.
- Our society has fallen to the point where we believe we are defined by our jobs.
  - Happiness has become a passive, self-serving pursuit in today's society.

- Society suggests that there is nothing that we are to do on our part for happiness.
- You can just find happiness.
- Happiness is not something that can be generated, according to the world, but something that you simply stumble across.
  - We speak of happiness as if it were not a decision on our part, but simply is the end result of a variety of circumstances.

- None of this, however, is what God is referring to.
- When God speaks of the need for Christians to be joyful, he is not implying that you should participate in selfish pursuits in order to be happy.
- The scriptures speak of having joy regardless of the circumstances.
  - Joy is an active responsibility to enjoy the life God has given us, regardless of our life situation.

- We can find joy regardless of what we are facing by:
  - 1. Through God's Word.
  - 2. By confessing and stopping sin.
  - 3. By taking a long range view of life.
  - 4. By thinking about others first.
    - 5. By remembering all that God has done.

### 1. Finding Joy through God's Word.

#### Romans 15:4-6, 13 nkjv

<sup>4</sup> For whatever things were written before were written for our learning, that we through the patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope. <sup>5</sup> Now may the God of patience and comfort grant you to be like-minded toward one another, according to Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup> that you may with one mind *and* one mouth glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>13</sup> Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

• Reading about people who came before us and overcome obstacles in their lives offers us hope that we, too, may succeed.

### 1. Finding Joy through God's Word.

#### Hebrews 13:5-6 nkjv

<sup>5</sup> Let your conduct be without covetousness; be content with such things as you have. For He Himself has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." <sup>6</sup> So we may boldly say: "The LORD is my helper; I will not fear. What can man do to me?"

### 2. Finding Joy by confessing and stopping sin.

#### Psalms 32:1-5 *nkjv*

<sup>1</sup>Blessed *is he whose* transgression *is* forgiven, whose sin *is* covered. <sup>2</sup>Blessed *is* the man to whom the LORD does not impute iniquity, And in whose spirit *there is* no deceit. <sup>3</sup>When I kept silent, my bones grew old through my groaning all the day long. <sup>4</sup>For day and night Your hand was heavy upon me; My vitality was turned into the drought of summer. <sup>5</sup>I acknowledged my sin to You, And my iniquity I have not hidden. I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD," And You forgave the iniquity of my sin.

- Sin is far more devastating than being out of fellowship with God (though this is very significant).
- Sin corrupts every part of our being.

### 3. Finding Joy by taking a long range view of life.

#### II Corinthians 4:16-18 nkjv

<sup>16</sup> Therefore we do not lose heart. Even though our outward man is perishing, yet the inward *man* is being renewed day by day. <sup>17</sup> For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding *and* eternal weight of glory, <sup>18</sup> while we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen *are* temporary, but the things which are not seen *are* eternal.

#### Hebrews 12:1-2 nkjv

<sup>1</sup>Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares *us*, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, <sup>2</sup> looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of *our* faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

- 3. Finding Joy by taking a long range view of life.
  - Our difficulties are momentary.
  - Jesus looked past the suffering and the shame of the cross and saw joy that was set before Him.
  - The joy was not in the suffering, but in the knowledge that His suffering would bring about future glory for all people.
    - Our lives now is about preparing ourselves to be with God.

### 4. Finding Joy by thinking about others first.

#### II Corinthians 8:1-5 nkjv

<sup>1</sup> Moreover, brethren, we make known to you the grace of God bestowed on the churches of Macedonia: <sup>2</sup> that in a great trial of affliction the abundance of their joy and their deep poverty abounded in the riches of their liberality. <sup>3</sup> For I bear witness that according to *their* ability, yes, and beyond *their* ability, *they were* freely willing, <sup>4</sup> imploring us with much urgency that we would receive the gift and the fellowship of the ministering to the saints. <sup>5</sup> And not *only* as we had hoped, but they first gave themselves to the Lord, and *then* to us by the will of God.

• Despite these difficulties, the Macedonian Christians had <u>an abundance of joy</u> because they could help others with a wealth of generosity.

What would we have done in their situation?

#### 5. Finding Joy by remembering all that God has done.

#### Hebrews 10:19-25 nkjv

<sup>19</sup> Therefore, brethren, having boldness to enter the Holiest by the blood of Jesus, <sup>20</sup> by a new and living way which He consecrated for us, through the veil, that is, His flesh, <sup>21</sup> and *having* a High Priest over the house of God, <sup>22</sup> let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. <sup>23</sup> Let us hold fast the confession of *our* hope without wavering, for He who promised *is* faithful. <sup>24</sup> And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, <sup>25</sup> not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as *is* the manner of some, but exhorting *one another*, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching.

- We need to focus on the things that really matter in life.
- Our difficulties are light and our suffering is small in comparison to what Jesus endured so that we could be with Him.

- While we will have pain and suffering in our lives, we can remain joyful, positive people because of the hope we have in Jesus.
- Turn to God's words in times of trouble and find encouragement.
- Keep your eyes on the prize.
- Focus on helping others instead of focusing on your own problems.
  - To obtain God's blessings, you must stop sinning.
